tom king

Tom King started out studying architecture at the Bartlett before training as a cabinet-maker under David Savage. He is currently also an engineer for the Shadow Robot Company, a small outfit in Islington specialising in anthropomorphic hands.

Tom's work is influenced by critical regionalism, an aspect of modernism that attempts to find a sense of place while still remaining part of a universal movement. His furniture is, therefore, often cut back to simple forms and expressed joinery, but very much rooted in regional materials and skills. At the same time a love of diverse design influences, cultivated at the Bartlett and strengthened by his experience in robotics, leads him to push traditional techniques into new forms, his overall design philosophy being more attached to what he enjoys at the time than a specific movement.

The Arts & Crafts Legacy

Furniture Designer / Makers today

The spirit and ideals of the Arts & Crafts makers in the early 20th Century are alive and well and being developed, for today, by today's designer / makers and expressed through new contemporary ideas and designs.

The legacy of the Arts & Crafts movement may be expressed in;- honesty to the materials and sound constructional principles: use of fine materials and finishes: relating furniture to peoples lives: the use of tools: restrained decoration – chamfers – beads and mouldings – stringing – panelling – marquetry - decorative metalwork and leather. This fine craftsmanship is practiced today although the style is different.

The earlier practitioners met to exchange ideas and formed the Artworkers Guild. They were interested in education and created The Central School of Arts & Crafts and they were strong on apprenticeships. They exhibited and formed The Arts & Crafts Exhibition Society (now The Society of Designer Craftsmen). Today many of these institutions continue and, in this electronic age, 200 furniture makers subscribe to an email forum (FDMA) where we discuss ideas and exchange information. An increasing number of workshops are running courses and taking apprentices and some of our universities teach fine furniture making.

The 6 makers in this exhibition are part of this national movement and work within 1 mile of Bedford Park.

Martin studied at The Central School of Arts & Crafts 1949 – 53 followed by 5 years as an assistant to leading architects and designers of that period. This experience has lead to a good understanding of buildings and architects' ideas about design.

'I aim' he says 'to make proper pieces of furniture that exploit traditional forms of construction but are, nevertheless, expressions of today. I work closely with my clients whose input has a strong influence in helping my creation of a new design for them' He believes that the success and beauty of a design lie as much in the quality and choice of materials as in the overall concept.
